What is the League?

- Association for Florida's Cities, Towns and Villages; Charter Counties Eligible
- Your Advocate, Partner and Resource
- Created in 1922 to Lobby, Foster Cooperation and Sharing, and to Provide Information
- HQ in Tallahassee; Office in Orlando for Insurance Services, Technology Services and FLC University



More About the League

- 209 Staff; one of the Largest in Nation
- Work Closely with National League of Cities also a member
- Hold Annual Conference every August; Legislative Conference each Fall
- Positions limited to municipal issues; must impact majority of municipalities – no individual member issues



League Membership

- Only a general-purpose local government providing municipal services can join the League; most do every year
- No affiliate, corporate or other members, per By-laws
- Have had 99% membership or 100% since 1980s

- FLC University training
- Financial and Insurance Services five pooled trusts and many services for local governments; risk and safety management; fraud investigations – Your Resource, Your Advocate, Your Partner!
- Publications, Resources



League Governance

- Board comprised of 3 officers; past presidents; 14 district directors, 10 largest city seats, and 2 other seats; re-districting after Census
- Elected for one year; persons can repeat
- Appoint executive director each year
- Board sets League policies, adopts budget and approves other fiscal statements; is guided by Strategic Plan
- Executive Committee: 15 members; can act on BOD behalf



FLC Legislative Process

- Policy Committees Consider State Legislative Positions
- Federal Action Strike Team (FAST) for Federal Matters
- Federal, Commemorative Resolutions go to Resolutions Committee
- FLC Goal: Year-round Advocacy plus Legislative Action Day each session
- President appoints Legislative Committees
- Even-numbered years: session January to March
- Odd-numbered years: session March to May
- League's legislative conference and adoption of annual priorities adapts to these two calendars
