# MORE ABOUT THE LEAGUE


- 215 employees; one of the largest in nation
- Works closely with the National League of Cities – also a member of the NLC
- Hosts Annual Conference every August;
  Legislative Conference each Fall



Positions limited to municipal issues; must impact majority of municipalities – no individual member issues

## League Membership

- Only a general-purpose local government providing municipal services can join the League; most do every year
- No affiliate, corporate or other members, per by-laws
- $\checkmark$ 
  - Statewide membership at 99-100% since the 1980s

## LEAGUE GOVERNANCE

- Board comprised of 3 officers, Past Presidents, 14 District Directors, 10 largest-city seats and 2 other seats; redistricting after census
- Elected for one year; terms can renew
  - Appoints Executive Director each year
- Board sets League policies, adopts budget and approves other fiscal statements; is guided by strategic plan
- Executive Committee: 15 members; can act on the Board's behalf



## **FLC LEGISLATIVE PROCESS**

- Policy Committees consider state legislative positions
- Federal Action Strike Team (FAST) advocates for federal issues
- Federal and commemorative resolutions go to the Resolutions Committee
- FLC Goal: Year-round advocacy plus Legislative Action Day each session
- President appoints Legislative Committees
- $\checkmark$
- Even-numbered years: session January to March
- $\checkmark$
- Odd-numbered years: session March to May

Resolutions Committees met today
