- HB 401 (Beltran) Sovereign Immunity Oppose The next committee stop for HB 401 is the
   House Appropriations Committee. The League will know by 4:30 p.m. today if the bill is on the
   April 12 House Appropriations Committee agenda. If it is on the committee agenda, the League
   will send out a legislative alert asking you to contact committee members to oppose the bill.
- PCB JDC3 (Judiciary Committee) Statutes of Limitations for Negligence Actions Support –
  Proposed Committee Bill (PCB) JDC3 will be heard on Tuesday, April 11, at 2:00 p.m. in the
  House Judiciary Committee. This is the first committee stop in the House. Currently, there is no
  Senate companion bill.

#### Jeff Branch Update:

- PCB COM3 (Commerce Committee) Natural Emergencies Support Proposed Committee Bill (PCB) COM3 will be heard today, April 10, at 2:00 p.m. in the House Commerce Committee. This is the first committee stop in the House. The Senate companion bill, SB 250 (Martin), passed its committees of reference and passed the full Senate.
- <u>HB 1071</u> (Duggan) and <u>SB 1068</u> (Collins) **Drone Delivery Services Support** HB 1071 will be heard today, April 10, at 2:00 p.m. in the House Infrastructure Strategies Committee. This is the final committee stop in the House. SB 1068 passed all its committees of reference and is on Second Reading on the Senate floor on April 12.

## Rebecca O'Hara Update:

- HB 975 (Holcomb) and SB 798 (Ingoglia) Solid Waste Management Oppose Neither bill is scheduled to be heard this week. HB 975 passed out of its first committee of reference and has two more committee stops. SB 798 has three committee stops and is still in its first committee of reference.
- HB 1331 (Busatta Cabrera) and SB 1380 (Jones) Municipal Utilities Oppose Neither bill is scheduled to be heard this week. HB 1331 has one more committee stop in the House, the House Commerce Committee. SB 1380 has three committee stops and is still in its first committee of reference.

## **Tara Taggart** Update:

HB 37 (Roach) and SB 774 (Brodeur) Financial Disclosures/Form 6 – Oppose – HB 37 will be heard on Tuesday, April 11, at 2:00 p.m. in the House State Affairs Committee. This is the last committee stop in the House. SB 774 passed all its committees of reference and is on Second Reading on the Senate floor on April 11. The full Senate will consider SB 774 on Tuesday, April 11.
